John Ellis, residence of Jones Court
citizen of Baltimore City.....and State of Maryland, who are reputable

and entitled to credit, and who being duly sworn, declare in relation to the foregoing case, as follows:

That he was a Private in Company I. H. Regt
W.S.C., and knows the aforesaid Josiah Cornish
who was Corporal in Co. D. H. Regiment of W.S.C.
and remembers when he said Cornish was wounded
at "Sugar Loaf" at C on 18th Feby 1865, in left shoulder
and right breast and that he was taken to the
field or Regimental Hospital, and remembers
when the Regiment on or about the 13th day of October
1865 returned to Washington D.C. and were distributed
and assigned to the different Forts among the defenses
of Washington, that Co. D & Co. I. were assigned to
Fort "Glocum" and also remembers that during
the time of removing the "Cannon", under orders
to destroy the fortifications, and while the said
Corporal "Cornish" was engaged at the said work
he was mashed by the wheel of a Carron against
the breach of one of the heavy Cannon, and was
so much injured that he was unable to walk
and was carried by his Comrades to the Regim-
ental Hospital and was never able to do duty after-
and is now unable on account of loss of use of left
arm, and weakness and misery in his breast unable
to earn a support by manual labor

and he further declare that he has no interest in said case, and is not concerned
in its prosecution, and is not related to said applicant.
