That his residence is no 90 Harrison Street Baltimore City, and has known the aforesaid Josiah Cornish for about four years, and have always found him a peaceful sober good citizen but apparently much afflicted, and seemingly unable to work at any regular business, which he has always attributed to injury received in the service of the United States, during the war of the rebellion as a soldier; also personally appeared "Thomas J. Foster" residing No 77 Mulligan Street Baltimore City, who declares that he has known the aforesaid Josiah Cornish for the last fifteen years and lived in same house with him for three years, and knows from his own knowledge that the said Cornish could not have earned by his odd jobs twenty five dollars per year on account of his continued suffering, with pain and misery in his breast, also pain and weakness in his left arm and shoulder, which he has suffered with during the whole period of time of fifteen years, the said Cornish wife being the main support of the family. and further declares that the physical condition of said "Cornish" when he returned home to Baltimore in May 1866 was very bad, and has so continued

and he further declare that he has no interest in said case, and is not concerned in its prosecution, and is not related to said applicant.
