When he left home he was in good health, and had been so for many years, and his loss to me leaving as many children as he did, and they all young, is very great. I have endeavored correctly, and as fully as possible to answer all the questions contained in the three Circulars accompanying this affidavit, that I possibly can, and to the truth of all my statements, I take my solemn obligation and affix my mark.
