On this day and date below written, personally appeared the affiant whose signature is hereto affixed and who being duly sworn according to law testified as follows:

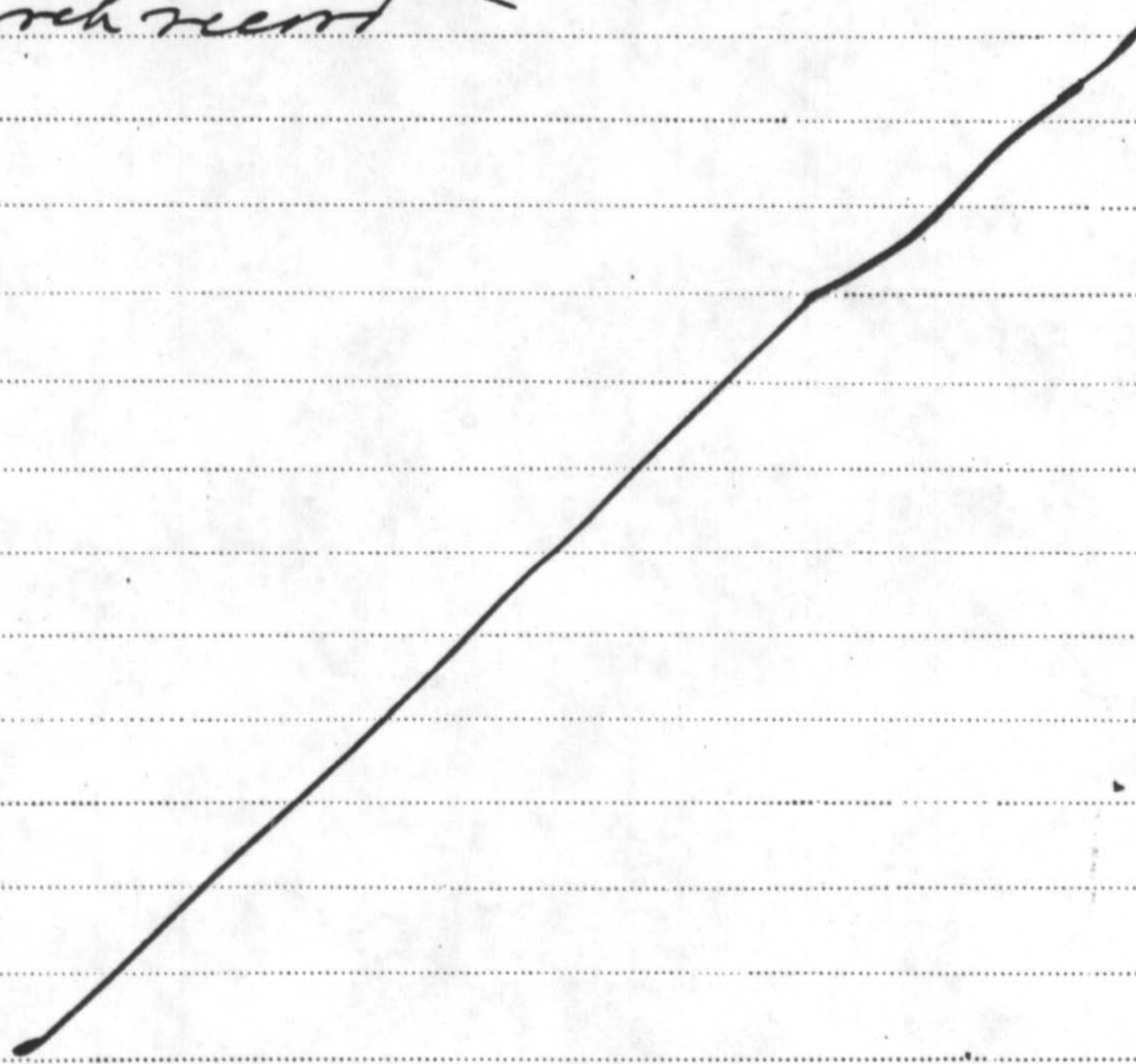
"My name is Charlotte L. Johnson

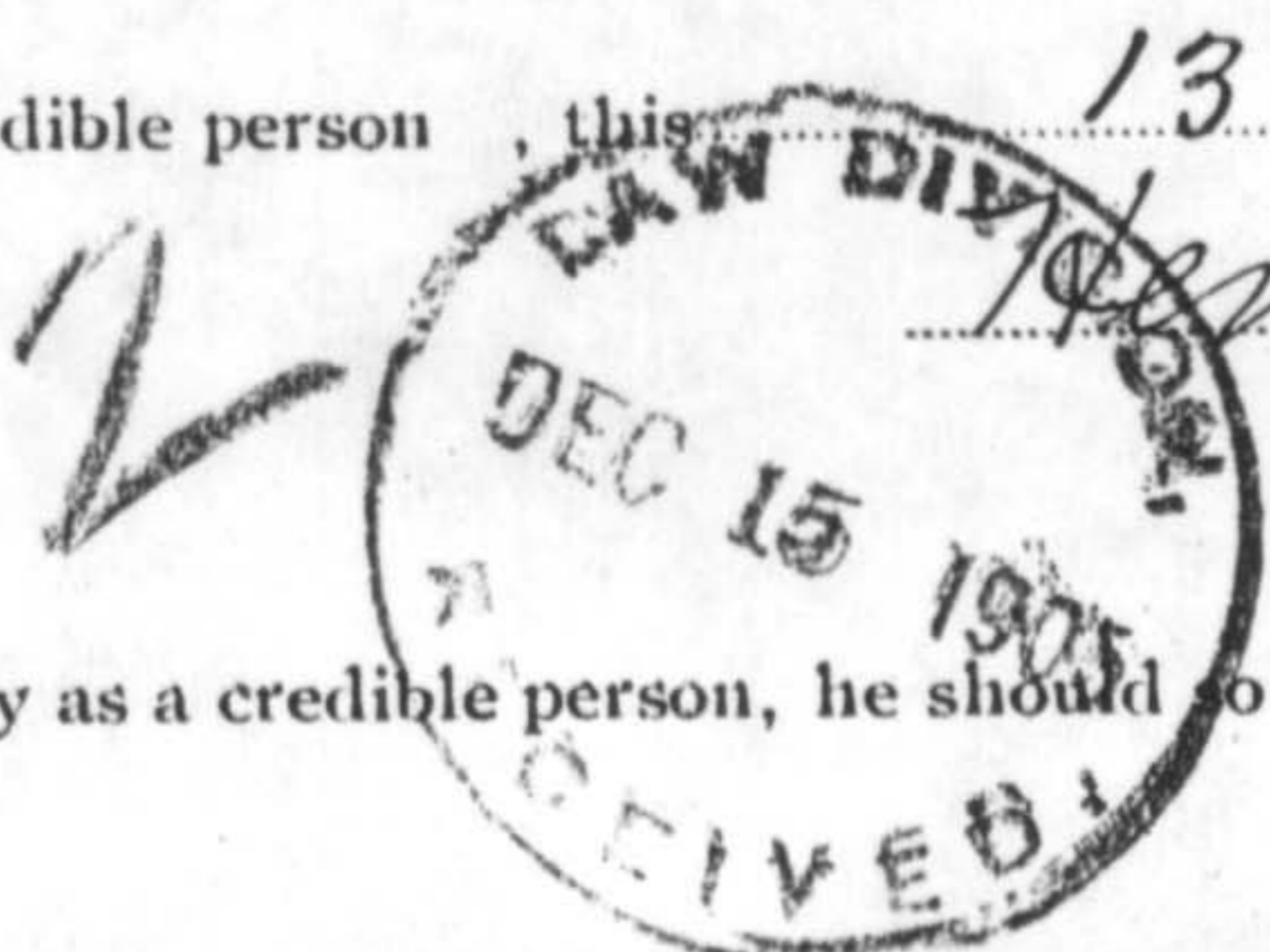

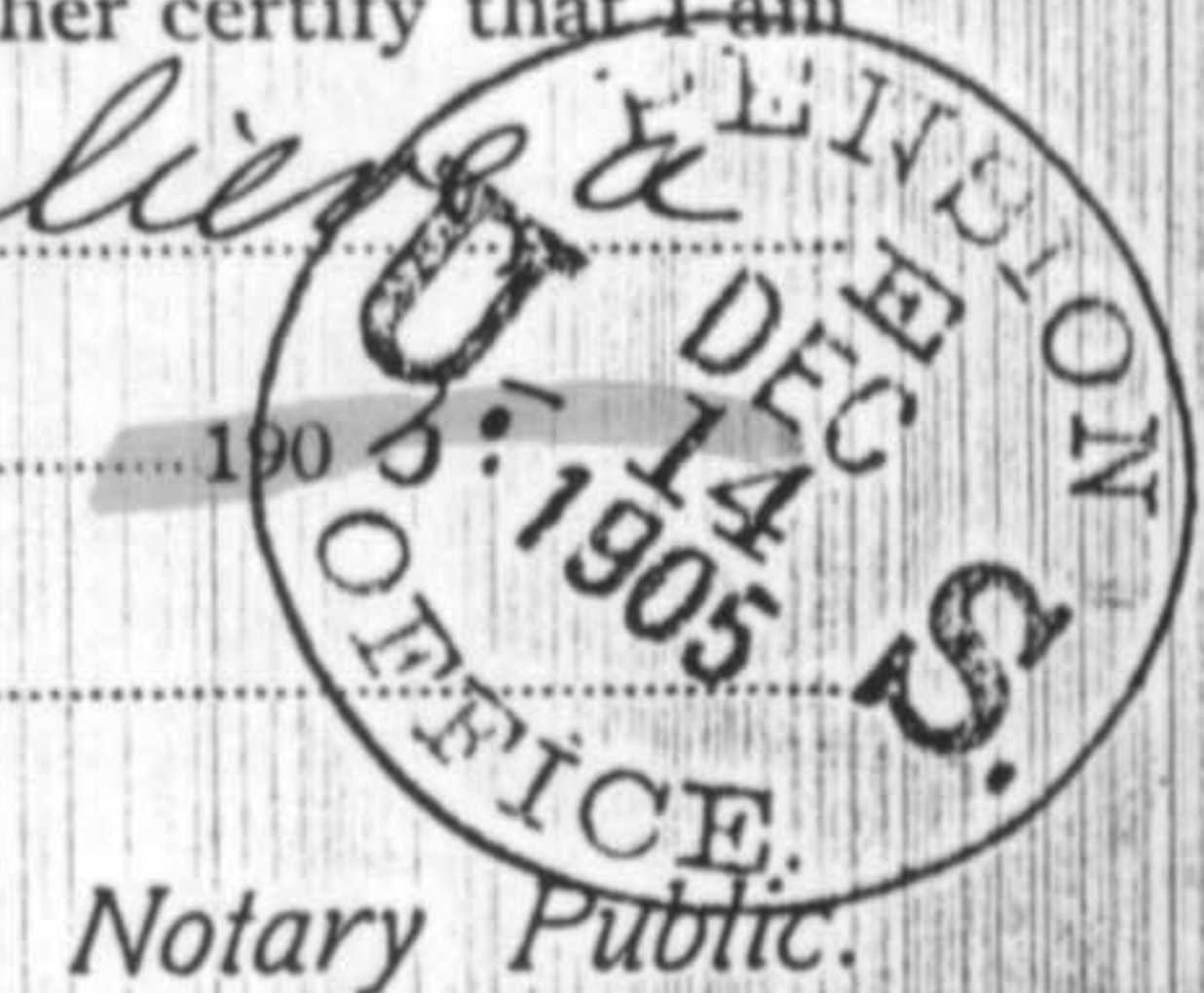
