

ACTS OF JUNE 27, 1890, AND MAY 9, 1900.

DECLARATION FOR WIDOW'S PENSION.

To be executed before a Court of Record or some officer thereof having custody of its seal, a Notary Public, or Justice of the Peace, whose official signature shall be verified by his official seal, and in case he has none, his signature and official character shall be certified by a Clerk of a Court of Record, or a City or County Clerk.

State of Maryland, City of Baltimore, County of Baltimore, SS:

On this 1st day of December, A. D. one thousand nine hundred and five, personally appeared before me, a Notary Public, within and for the County and State aforesaid, Charlotte L. Johnson, aged 45 years, a resident of Baltimore, State of Maryland, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that she is the widow of Isaac Johnson, who enlisted under the name of Isaac Johnson, on the ... day of ... A. D. 18... as a private in Company D, in the 9th Regiment of ... Volunteers, and served at least ninety days in the late War of the Rebellion, in the service of the United States, who was HONORABLY DISCHARGED, and died November 27th 1905. That he was not employed in the military or naval service otherwise than as stated above. That she was married under the name of Charlotte L. Willman to said Isaac Johnson, on the 7th day of January A. D. 1875, by Rev. J. Cabin Allen at Baltimore Md, there being no legal barrier to such marriage; that she had not been previously married; that her said husband had not been previously married. That she has not remarried since the death of the said Isaac Johnson. That she is without other means of support than her daily labor and an actual net income not exceeding \$250 per year. That the names and dates of birth of all the children of the soldier, now living, and under sixteen years of age, are as follows: None, born ... That she has not abandoned the support of any one of her children, but that they are still under her care or maintenance. That no prior application for pension has been filed by herself or the soldier. That she makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension-roll of the United States, under the provisions of the acts of June 27, 1890, and May 9, 1900. She hereby appoints, with full power of substitution and revocation, Baltimore, Md. her true and lawful attorney to prosecute her claim, the fee to be TEN DOLLARS, payable as prescribed by law.
