 answer truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this special
 examination of aforesaid claim for pension, deposes and says:

1 *in Baltimore always said he*
 2 *never had a prior wife -*
 3 *Isaac Johnson never lived*
 4 *with or claimed any woman*
 5 *as wife before he married me*
 6 *that I ever knew or heard of.*
 7 *From the time of my said*
 8 *marriage to Isaac Johnson*
 9 *till he died on Nov. 27, 1901*
 10 *I lived with him as his wife*
 11 *without separation or divorce*
 12 *and I have not remarried*
 13 *or cohabited with any man*
 14 *since he died.*
 15 *He left no child surviving -*
 16 *He had no property of any kind*
 17 *when he died. There was no*
 18 *insurance on his life. I owned*
 19 *no property of any kind character*
 20 *or description when my said*
 21 *husband died, and have owned*
 22 *none since then. I have had*
 23 *no income from any source*
 24 *since then except from my own*
 25 *manual labor.*
 26 *My maiden name was Charlotte*
 27 *Pillman. My father was Wm. Pillman*
 28 *and my mother was Charlotte Pillman*
 29 *I have one sister Rosetta Wiggins*
