

DECLARATION FOR INCREASE OF PENSION and New Disability Under Acts of June 27, 1890, and May 9, 1900.

State of Maryland, County of Baltimore, ss:

ON THIS 25th day of April A. D. one thousand nine hundred and four

personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace

within and for the County and State aforesaid, Nathan Johnson, aged 62

years, a resident of the 626 George Street, County of Baltimore

State of Maryland, who being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is a pensioner

of the United States, enrolled at the Washington D.C. Pension Agency, at the rate

of six dollars per month, Certificate No. 564793, by reason of disability from

disability for which pension was granted "Injury to Back"

That he was a Private in Co. D, 7th U.S. Troops Vols.

having enlisted on 26 Sept 1863 and honorably discharged on Nov. 16/1866

That he has not been employed in the Military or Naval service otherwise than as stated above.

That he did not serve prior to 26 Sept 1863 nor since Nov. 16/1866

That he believes himself to be entitled to an increase of pension on account of disability and inability to perform manual labor. Increased disability and inability to perform manual labor.

And he also believes himself to be entitled to a further increase of pension on account of the following disabilities for which he has not heretofore been pensioned. Rheumatism and

entire numbness of right side (paralysis) affecting hip & limb, making walking difficult, also arm. - Frost Bitten fingers

That said disabilities are not the result of his vicious habits and are to the best of his knowledge permanent in character; that he appoints

Geo. W. F. Vernon of 106 E. Saratoga St, County of Baltimore, State of Maryland, his true and lawful attorney to prosecute his claim.

That his Post-Office address is 626 George Street, Baltimore, State of Maryland
