

DECLARATION FOR INVALID PENSION.

ACT OF JUNE, 27, 1890.

To be Executed Before a Court of Record or some Officer Thereof Having Custody of Its Seal.

State of Maryland, County of Baltimore, ss:

On this 12<sup>th</sup> day of July, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and ninety

personally appeared before me, JUSTICE OF THE PEACE of the court, a court of record within and for the County and State aforesaid Nathan Johnson

aged 48 years, a resident of the 610 Stirling St., county of Baltimore, State of Maryland, who, being duly sworn according to law,

declares that he is the identical Nathan Johnson who was enrolled on the 26<sup>th</sup> day of Sept, 1863, in Co. D. 4<sup>th</sup> regt U. S. C. Here state rank, company, and regiment in military service, or vessel, if in the Navy.

P. as a Private mustered out at Indianola Texas, in the War of the Rebellion, and served at least ninety days, and was honorably discharged at Fort Federal

Hall Balto Md on the 13<sup>th</sup> day of October, 1866. That he is now unable to earn a support by reason of Injury to back, Deaf-

ness in right ear. and repeated injury to back in Libby Prison. Neuralgia in Head.

That said disabilities are not due to his vicious habits, and are to the best of his knowledge and belief permanent; that he has applied for pension under application No. 739,932; that he is a pensioner under Certificate No.                     . If a pensioner, the certificate number only need be given; if not, give the number of the former application, if one was made.

That he makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension-roll of the United States under the provisions of the Act of June 27, 1890.

He hereby appoints, with full power of substitution and revocation Geo. M. F. Vernon 108 St. Paul St., of Baltimore, State of Maryland, his true and lawful attorney, to prosecute his claim; and to receive
