

Declaration for Widow's Pension.

ACT OF APRIL 19, 1908. AS AMENDED SEPTEMBER 8, 1916.

State of Maryland County of Baltimore SS:

On this 5th day of March, A. D. one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, personally appeared before me, a JUSTICE OF THE PEACE

within and for the County and State aforesaid, Emma J. Johnson

Who, being duly sworn according to law, makes the following declaration in order to obtain a pension, under the provisions of the Act of Congress approved April 19, 1908, amended September 8, 1916

declares that she is about years of age, that she was born 18, at Baltimore

The she is the widow of Nathan Johnson, who was

Enrolled under the name of Nathan Johnson

on the 7th day of September, 1866, as a private in Co. D

7th Reg't U.S.C. Inf Vols., and honorably discharged November, 1866, having served ninety days or more during the late Civil War.

That she was married under the name of Emma J. Snowden to said soldier

at Baltimore City, Md on the 4th day of May, 1913

by Rev John A. Holmes; that there was no legal barrier to the marriage; that she had never been previously married; That the soldier had never been previously married

former marriage by claimant & soldier dissolved by death
(If there was a prior marriage of either the date and place of death or divorce of former consort or consorts should be stated.)

That the said soldier died February 21st, 1919, at Baltimore City Md, that she was not divorced from him; that she has not remarried since his death.

That the said soldier left the following-named children who are now living and under 16 years of age, to wit:

- born 1 at 1

- born 1 at 1
- born 1 at 1

That the above named child is of the soldier (or sailor) is now receiving a pension, and that such chld is a member of her family and is cared for by her.

That she has not heretofore applied for pension her deceased husband's

on which it was based, and the name of the soldier should be stated, and if husband was a pensioner, give number of his certificate.) Civil War Cert. 564793

That she hereby appoints with full power of substitution, and revocation

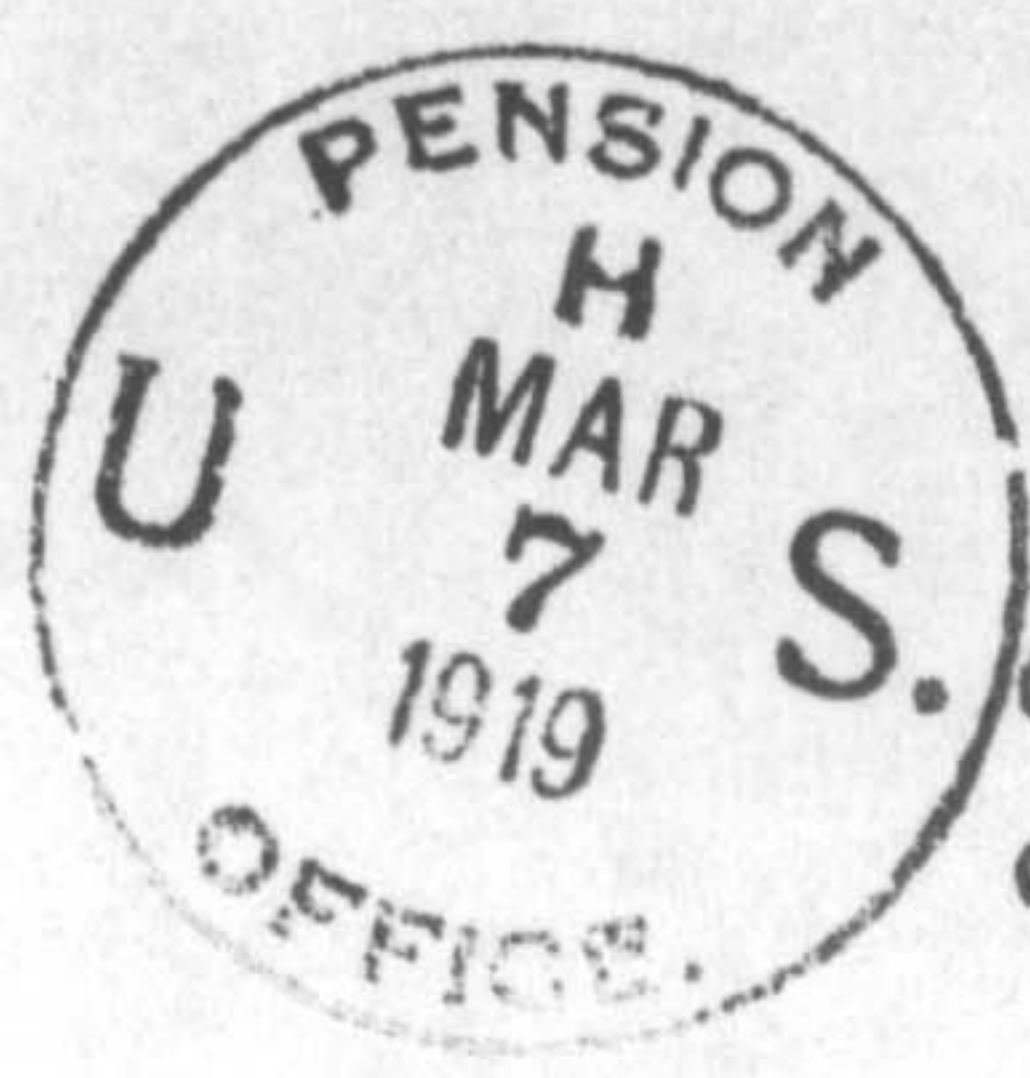
