

DEPOSITION

Case of Nathan Johnson, No. 564793

On this 21st day of April, 1891, at

Centerville County of Calverton,
State of Virginia, before me, John A. Calverton, a
Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared

Nathan Johnson, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid pension claim, deposes and says: in front of Richmond

Va, for the Rebels I had to carry heavy stone for the breast work and in carrying on lifting one of these heavy stones I strained my back and have pains in my back ever since. No sin, I did not stop work after straining my back that day but continued to work on the breast work for some days thereafter although in misery. My pains of back were in the small of my back, the same location as were the pains caused from the fall of log at Camp Bendish mid winter of 1862-4.

I was captured in Sept, 1864 at the battle of Fort Gilmore I can't locate the Ft. if it was near Ft. Harrison I can't say if it was near Chapens farm I do know that it was in the locality of Richmond Va, and that the Rebels occupied the Ft. Gilmore, and we were charging the Ft. when captured. I was taken from there direct to Libby there was quite a number of my Co & regt then captured & we were all put in Libby prison & had been there some time 2 or 3
