On this 26<sup>th</sup> day of February, 1896 at  
 Chestertown, County of Kent,  
 State of Maryland, before me, Joseph S. Bowler, a  
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared Henry  
 Worrall, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer  
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid  
 pension claim, deposes and says: My full name is Henry

Worrall, age about 56, occupation  
 laborer, present place of address is  
 Chestertown, Kent Co. Maryland.  
 I served in Co. "D" 4<sup>th</sup> Regiment  
 U. S. Col. Infantry for 3 years  
 as private Corporal. I enlisted  
 in September 1863, and was  
 mustered out with the Company  
 and was mustered out Nov.  
 1866 at Fort Federal Hill, Baltimore.  
 I became acquainted with Nathan  
 Johnson the Claimant who was a  
 member of my Company after I  
 enlisted. He did not fight with  
 me, but his brother Isaac Johnson did.  
 He was a stout kind of man  
 of a complexion of Chestnut Color.  
 I first became acquainted with  
 him at Camp Belger, Baltimore.  
 He was with the Company when  
 I joined it. I recollect seeing  
 him both some time before  
 of his having a sore foot while  
 you was at the Hospital. I don't
