DECLARATION FOR WIDOW'S PENSION

Act of April 19, 1908, September 8, 1916 and May 1, 1920

STATE OF Maryland, COUNTY of City of Baltimore, ss:
 On this 22 day of March, 1923, personally appeared before me, a justice of the peace
 within and for the County and State aforesaid, Sarah J. Bennett, who, being duly
 sworn by me according to law, declares that she is 67 years of age and that she was born April 26th, 1855,
 at Baltimore, Maryland.
 That she is the widow of Charles Bennett, who enlisted September 27, 1863
 at Baltimore, Maryland, under the name of Charles Bennett
 as a private in Co. E, U. S. Col. Vol. Troops (Harlan P.
(Rank) Spaulding) the company and regiment, if in the U. S. Army; or vessels, if in the U. S. Navy.)
Oct. 13th, 1866, having served ninety days or more during the Civil War.

that he also served. (Here give a complete statement of all other military, naval, or coast guard service, if any, at whatever time rendered.)

That otherwise than as herein stated said soldier (or sailor) was not employed in the United States service.

That she was married to said soldier (or sailor) on June 12th, 1890, 1, under the name of Sarah J. Bennett, nee Brown, at Baltimore, Maryland.

 That she makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension roll of the United States under the provisions of the
 ACTS OF APRIL 19, 1908, ACT OF SEPTEMBER 8, 1916, ACT OF MAY 1, 1920, and for accrued pension.

She hereby appoints, with full power of substitution and revocation,

 her true and lawful attorney to prosecute her claims, and to receive therefor legal fees.
