Here give the claimant's statement (as briefly and as compactly as possible) in regard to the date of origin and cause of his disabilities and the manner in which they affect him.

He receives a pension of 58 dollars per month. He makes the following statement in regard to the origin of his disabilities and date when first discovered by him:

Birthplace, Galters Ind; age, 81 years; height, 5.8; weight, 160 pounds; complexion, Dark; color of eyes, Brown; color of hair, Gray; occupation, Retired; permanent marks and scars other than those described below,

We hereby certify that upon examination we find the following objective conditions:

Pulse rate, 90; respiration, 20; temperature, 98.5

Here give a full description of the disabilities, in accordance with Book of instructions, and make a separate paragraph for each disability.

Facts within the knowledge of the Board, or any member thereof, relative to the cause of any disability found should be stated.

Act June 5-20, Survivors Spanish War: Estimate incapacity from all causes not due to vicious habits at one-fourth, one-half, three-fourths, or total.

Whenever a disability is shown or is believed to be due to or aggravated by vicious habits, the opinion of the Board must be stated. When not due to such habits, this fact must be stated.

§72 Cases: In every instance where aid and attendance is alleged, the Board will state (in so many words) whether the regular aid and attendance of another person is or is not required.

When rates are recommended solely on subjective evidence the strongest reasons must be given therefor.

Heart: - Nervous
Lungs: suffers with asthma
Kidney: normal, suffers with enlarged prostate gland & cystitis requiring him to get up several times each night to pass water
Eyes: Sight defective, probably beginning of cataract, can distinguish people but can not see to read newspaper print not corrected by glasses
Complains of rheumatism in shoulders & back has appearance of droppical person both ankles swollen about twice their normal size requiring him to use cane in walking & assistance of another person in dressing & undressing & in going around.
