to be reputable and entitled to credit and who being duly sworn, declare in relation to aforesaid case, as follows:

I am a Physician in regular practice, and first attended professionally the said Henry Johnson on the 7th day of April A. D. 1875; he was then able to walk about the house, and in pleasant weather walk out doors.

There was some emaciation, cough and hurried respiration, night sweats, curved and elongated nails, irritative fevers and bloody expectoration

I further declare I continued my professional attendance on the said Henry Johnson to the date of his death, which occurred on the 7th day of Novr

A. D. 1875. — during my treatment there was for a time some mitigation of his sufferings, but he continued to decline in strength and died on the date aforesaid.

No autopsy was held, I gave the certificate of his death as required by the Health Department of Baltimore, and stated the cause of his death to be Consumption

I also declare the said Henry Johnson, by reason of the said disability, was unable to perform or engage in the duties of his usual occupation.

I also further declare the habits of the said Henry Johnson were good and strictly temperate

I further declare that I have no interest in said case, and I am not concerned in its prosecution.
