

Examining Surgeon's Certificate.

Balt Oct 27th, 1866.

Applicant's service.

I hereby certify, That I have carefully examined Shadrack Boulson, late a private Co. & 1st Regt U.S. Col Troops in the service of the United States, who was discharged at Baltimore Md., on the day of July, 1864, and is an applicant for an invalid pension, by reason of alleged disability resulting from loss of sight.

Degree of disability.

In my opinion the said Shadrack Boulson is totally incapacitated for obtaining his subsistence by manual labor from the cause above stated.

Origin.

Judging from his present condition, and from the evidence before me, it is my belief that the said disability arose in the service aforesaid in the line of duty.

Probable duration.

The disability is permanent.
