

DECLARATION FOR WIDOW'S PENSION.

State of Maryland, County of Baltimore §§:

On the 6th day of September, A. D. one thousand nine hundred and ten personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace within and for the county and state aforesaid Fannie Cooper aged 60 years, a resident of Baltimore City, County of Maryland, State of Maryland, who, being duly sworn according to law, makes the following declaration in order to obtain pension under the provisions of the Act of Congress Approved, April 19, 1908.

That she is the widow of George Cooper, who was enrolled under the name of George Cooper, at as a private in Co. "B," 7th Regt. M.S.C. Vol. Inf. and honorably discharged November 16, 1866, having served ninety days or more during the late civil war.

That he also served (Here give a complete statement of all other services if any.)

That he was not in the military or naval service of the United States otherwise than as stated above.

That she was married under the name of Fannie Johnson to said soldier at Baltimore Md on the 1st day of April 1868 by Rev Henry Hutton; that there was no legal barrier to the marriage; that she had not been previously married; that the soldier had not been previously married.

(If there was a prior marriage of either, the date and place of death or divorce of former consort or consorts should be stated.)

and that neither she nor said soldier married otherwise than is stated above.

That the said soldier died September 10, 1910, at Balto City Md; that she was not divorced from him, and that she has not remarried since his death.

That the said soldier left the following-named children who are now living, and under sixteen years of age, to wit: (If the soldier left no children, the claimant should so state.)

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That she has not heretofore applied for pension her deceased husband was a pensioner Certificate No 74785, Oct 7 6 1907 service on which it was based, and the name of the soldier should be stated.)

She hereby appoints, with full power of substitution and revocation, David S. Smith 528 W. Franklin St of Baltimore State of Maryland her true and lawful attorney to prosecute her claim, and to receive therefor a fee of \$10.
