We hereby certify that in compliance with the requirements of the law we have carefully examined this applicant, who states that he is suffering from the following disability, incurred in the service, viz: Disease of left testicle, and disease of spine

Cause of disability.

and that he receives a pension of \$8.00 dollars per month.

Here give the claimant's statement as briefly and as compactly as possible.

He makes the following statement upon which he bases his claim for Restoration
[Original, increase, restoration, &c.]
That disease of left testicle followed an attack of mumps in 1863 (in service) and that he is not able to make a fair living by manual labor

Upon examination we find the following objective conditions: Pulse rate, 100; respiration, 20; temperature, 98; height, 5 feet 9 inches; weight, 145 pounds; age, 53 years.

Here give a full description of the disabilities, in accordance with Book of Instructions.

Disease of left testicle. - We find the left testis wasted away and more or less tender to touch. It is about the size of the end of the little finger of a little man, very likely a sequel to mumps, as claimant alleges.

Disease of spine. - We do not find disease. There is no tenderness over the spine. No abnormality. Claimant stoops and recovers without difficulty. No evidence of muscular incoordination. No paralysis of bladder or rectum, or other symptoms of spinal lesion.

The actual and probable origin of every existing disability must be fully set forth. Whenever a disability is shown, or is believed to be due to or aggravated by vicious habits the opinion of the board must be stated. When not due to such habits this fact must be stated.

Heart. - (not in red order.) Sounds clear, apex beat in 5th intercostal space on mamillary line - pulse regular and equal, but rapid and weak. Sitting 100 - standing 120 - after turns about room 132. We do not discover indications of alcoholism. Claimant says he can't use coffee or tobacco, because of effect on the heart. That his beverage is a small cup of weak tea morning and evening - we diagnose a weak and irritable heart.

No signs of vicious habits.
