DECLARATION FOR WIDOW'S PENSION.

State of Maryland, County of Baltimore ss:

On this 31 day of August, A. D. one thousand nine hundred and 12 personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace within and for the county and state aforesaid Annia L. Perkins aged 42 years, a resident of 546 W. Hoffman St, County of Baltimore, State of Maryland, who, being duly sworn according to law, makes the following declaration in order to obtain pension under the provisions of the Act of Congress Approved, April 19, 1908.

That she is the widow of Stephen Perkins, who was (Enrolled or commissioned) under the name of Stephen Perkins at on the day of 18

as a in Co B 7th USPT Here state rank, and company and regiment, in the Army, or vessels, if in the Navy.

and honorably discharged 1912, having served ninety days or more during the late civil war.
