Dr. Chamberlin deceased, attended my mother at my birth, and when I was a small boy gave me papers showing that I was born on March 1 - 1833 - My mother belonged to him in slavery - That paper was lost by me at New Market Va. with other personal property in my knapsack as we were ordered to unsling knapsacks and sent to the front in a fight. The knapsacks were never recovered as we did not return to that locality.
