Sevan, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid
 pension claim, deposes and says: I am *59* years of age,

I do day labor, reside and my P.O.
 address is *903 Morris St* this City

I was priv. Co. D, 19 U. S. C. I
 enlisted Dec 1863 and was discharged
 Jan'y 1867.

I know this clmt met him first
 & in the above regt. he was a member
 Co. H, 19. U. S. C. I enlisted or joined the
 regt some months after I did, and I
 saw him often during service, I cant
 say when he was discharge, I
 remember that sometime before the
 fall of Richmond Va. he was sick
 and sent to hospital and I never saw
 him in service after that, I cant say
 now as to nature of his sickness,
 know of his being in hospital, by
 inquiring for him and was informed
 by some one of his Co. that he was
 in hospital, I met him next in 1867
 here in Balto. and have seen him about
 once a week since 1867. since the war
 he has been in poor health at
 least he has so appeared to me, I
 cant now remember of any special
 distase had by this clmt till some
 12 or 13 years ago, he had Paralysis
