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- to exposure,
- Q Did your stomach continue to be affected all the time you were in the service. If so, what were the symptoms,
- A I was affected more or less with weakness of stomach after I went to hospital as stated, sometimes I would feel pretty well, and then I would get so that when I ate anything I would throw it up, I could not retain my food on my stomach,
- Q How soon after your enlistment did you have gravel or symptoms of gravel,
- A I had a touch of the gravel about three months after I enlisted,
- Q What duty did you perform while acting as orderly for Col Bowman,
- A All I did while with Col Bowman, was to see that his clothes, <sup>were</sup> properly cared for, attend to his letter stamps and liquors, and to Bank his money, I boarded at Home,
- Q What business did you follow for three years prior to enlistment,
- A I drove private carriage for Robert Barell, Pennsylvania Gunsmith, for seven years, he left Baltimore and went back to Paris, I then drove for Mr Alexander Brown, (private carriage) for three or four months, I left him to enlist,
- Q Who was your family physician before you enlisted
- A Dr Orrick (since dead) attended my family, but I had no Doctor personally before I enlisted
- Q Who is well acquainted with the condition of your health before enlistment
- A Samuel T. Fisher, Samuel Hall, and George Fredericks knew me well before I enlisted,
- Q What has been your physical condition from date of discharge to present time,
- A I had a kind of aching cramp or misery in my stomach when I was discharged, and that has continued at intervals ever since, some days I feel right smart, and other days I don't feel well,
- Q Have you had any medical treatment since your discharge from the U.S. Army, if so, who treated you and when,
- A I have had no treatment since discharge except for an abscess in stomach about eight, nine years ago, by young Dr Gardner, he lanced the abscess, he attended me for about two months,
- Q What business have you followed since discharge,
- A The first work I did after discharge commenced about two months after discharge, I then went to work in Arthur Mann, living stable at Broadway horses and Chipping horses, I continued with Arthur Mann about six months, I then went to driving private carriage for
