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Q How long did you work for Leuakou, Did you quit him, or did he discharge you, Why did you avoid going with me to see Leuakou,

A I worked for him about seven years, I did not care to go to see him because he kept a months wages from me without just cause, A fellow servant named Charles Mitchell, since dead, reported that I took a lot of coloured people in the family Carriage out in the Country one morning with a large basket upon the front of the box, Leuakou discharged me for that and kept one months wages from me, I have never spoken to him since, I was innocent of the charge,

Q Is there any person who knows you were physically disqualified for purposes of Manual Labour while in Leuakou's employ,

A I can't say there is, because I generally attended to my duty, though I know I suffered greatly at times with nervous Headaches, and pains in my back

Q Did you ever have any treatment (Medical treatment) since the war, for disease of stomach,

A I have not, though I had sick headache often when I was constipated,

Q Do you have any symptoms of stomach disarrangement now,

A I have at times a cramp in the stomach just about the Navel, that is relieved generally by leaning forward, when I lean back it is painful,

Q Do you have any trouble with your kidneys or bladder now,

A No Sir,

Q Do you know where any of your Military Comrades are, except John Diggs,

A I do not,

Q Have you been afforded an opportunity of being present during the examination of your claim for a pension, and of questioning witnesses,

A I have,

Q Are you satisfied with the manner I have conducted the examination,

A I am
