DEPOSITION B

Case of James Heuson, No. 328330

- On this 21 day of September, 1883, at
Near Lovanstown, County of Baltimore
 State of Maryland, before me, James H. Colburn, a
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared David S. DeCoursey,
 who, being by me first duly sworn to answer
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of afore-
 said pension claim, deposes and says: his age is 58 years, resides at 64
Demid Hill Avenue, Baltimore Md, but is now em-
 ployed by E. G. Perrino in Baltimore Co, I well
 acquainted with the Claimant James Heuson,
 has known him since 1852, was intimate with him
 when he enlisted, at that time Claimant drove
 Carriage for M^{rs} Alexander Brown, since deceased
 Affiant drove for W^m F. Dalrymple, they were neigh-
 bors, the Claimant was a healthy man to date of enlist-
 ment, never knew him to be sick before enlistment
- Q Do you know anything of his health while in the Army
 A I do not,
- Q What has been his physical condition since discharge
 A Well he has seemed rather feeble and has complained
 almost constantly of being unwell, but really I dont
 know what has been the matter, except winter
 before last he was laid up with a long spell, I believe
 he then suffered with his back
- Q Do you know what was the matter with his back
 A I dont know, I called to see him twice, his complaint
 was of his back
- Q Do you remember him working for Arthur H. Mann
 or Driving Carriage for Thomas Sanahan since the war
 A Yes Sir, I remember that he did work for them
 gentlemen,
- Q Was he physically disabled in any manner while
 in their employ
 A I dont remember him being laid by for any cause
