deflected to the left, and is tremulous. Articulation is much impaired and at times it is difficult to understand him. Constant dribbling of saliva, the whiskers being saturated. Eyes are normal in appearance. Vision 20-60, glasses correct. Hearing is dull, but he hears ordinary conversation at 6 feet. Heart: Apex slightly to the left and downward. Action is weak and irregular with occasional intermission. Slight mitral regurgitant murmur. There is no apparent disability from this cause. Lungs are in healthy condition. Lumbago: Sensitiveness in the lumbar regions with pain when stooping and rising. Cannot pick objects from the floor without giving at the knees and has some difficulty in rising. Claimant is in a state of nervous debility as the result of Left Hemiplegia, and is mentally and physically incapacitated for the performance of manual labor. We would recommend the full rating under the Act. No disability other than above described.
