

Q. In your position it was the young man with glasses who swore you?
A. Well now I am not sure. The only persons I ever saw there, who seemed to belong there, was Mr. Lloyd and his young man clerk who wears glasses and the young lady. I have not been there for over a year now and the young man with glasses was there then, also the young lady. I am pretty sure that I never saw any other man there in Lloyd's office. I don't know the names of the clerks there. I never heard the name of E. E. Werner, or O. W. Beale or B. B. Tread that I know. I never took any witnesses to Mr. Lloyd and I never regarded him as my attorney. I never knowingly applied for pension through Mr. Lloyd. I never employed him or asked him to apply for me. I remember he sent for me once and asked me if I had been in the Army since I was discharged from the late war and I said I had not but I did not ^{sign} make any papers then. Another time he sent for me and gave me a blank to have my doctor fill out and swear to, but I did not do it. I never once thought he was my attorney because I did not have any witnesses to enter up a claim, as I knew was necessary, and he did not ask me for any witnesses to identify me. I recognize my signature to the paper you now show me (Dec. 15/92). I know nothing of that paper being an application for pension. I never had no such witnesses as named there (Beale and Tread) and they did not know me. - Joe W. Green and Joe W. Beaker and Geo C. Ninyew & Geo Cooper were the only witnesses I ever had - except Dr. Keller who witnessed for me. Yes sir, I am most confident now that the young man who wears glasses and who wrote the paper designed at Lloyd's office, the day I took my letter of rejection there, is the same man who swore me to the paper. I am sure I never saw any other clerk or man there except Mr. Lloyd himself. I never signed and swore to the paper there that I know of. I fully understand the contents of this deposition and my answers are correctly recorded.
