I am a brother of the claimant, Fannie
Bates now Gibson

We have been living at Minnerville Md. for
 the past 20 years, until she moved to
Baltimore Md. some 3 or 4 years ago.

I knew Henry Bates about one year prior
 to the time he married my sister. He
 said he came from Va. but what part I
 don't know. I think Joe Farmers brought
 him here. I do not know where he is,
 I do not know any one that came
 here with Bates. I could not say
 whether he was from the Eastern or Western
 shing Va.

My sister was married to him by
 license by George Waters (deaf) I can-
 not tell the date and was not present,
 I heard all about the wedding at the time,
 From that time I knew they lived
 together as man & wife till he went
 away and left her, think they lived to-
 gether 7 or 8 years. He left her but I do
 not know what for. He went to Baltimore Md.
 and was there when I last heard of him,
 Neither, nor ever divorced to my knowledge
