pension claim, deposes and says: I am about my 58<sup>th</sup> yearResidence 1402 Shields Alley BaltoMD. I am a laborer.Fanny Gibson is my sister. I know  
her husband John Gibson from before  
the war. and knew his first wife  
Maria Sampson.John Gibson enlisted the same time  
he died. and we served together in Co  
A 7 U.S.C. Vol Inf and he came  
home together. They were part of  
regiment at ~~Camp~~ Federal Hill. the cityI don't know if he had an H in his  
name - but - if you will allow me  
to refer to my old roll I can tell you  
He was a corporal. He was married  
to Maria Sampson before he went to  
the war. and she died after the war  
I couldn't tell the date I was livingin Baltimore when she died. I have  
lived in Baltimore ever since 187.I couldn't tell what year he married  
my sister Fanny. I know that  
the John Gibson who was a corp in  
Co A 7 U.S.C. and enlisted with me  
Sept-26 1863. and was mustered  
out with me at ~~Camp~~ Federal Hill  
in 1866. is the same John Gibson.
