

to Mr Rosier and I lived with him up to the time of his death and we were never separated except when we were both working out. No divorce ever took place between us, and I have remained a widow up to this day. I have never lived or cohabited with any other man either before or after my husband's death.

To wit. I had nothing to do with getting out the marriage license where my husband's name appears as Elbert. That was his proper name the name I knew him by, but his mother and people generally, called him Elby for short.

When Dr. Killian was going to certify to my husband's death he asked me his full name and I gave it Elbert, and as so appears in the record. The only people that knew him (so far as I know) before and while he was in the army are Mr. Green 524 N. Biddle Street, and Mr. Lewis Dyer 224 N. Hill.

I have no income whatever except what I earn at Laundry work, perhaps in winter four dollars a week, but not so much in summer when people are away.

When my husband died he owned the house 1309 Division Street. He bought that house by paying down \$800<sup>00</sup> cash which he borrowed from my mother, and he paid besides that he paid by instalments to the building society \$754<sup>10</sup>; making the cost of the house about \$1554<sup>10</sup>. We did not own the ground that the house was on we had to pay ground rent of \$77<sup>50</sup> per year. [The examiner inspected the book.
