Emory. He lives about a mile from here. Dennis Miller was my orderly sergeant. I don't know where he is. I don't know where any of my officers are.

Q. I will now read you the list of comrades with your case and ask you to name those, if any, who might be able to testify to your physical condition in the service.

A. Well sir, of those whose names you have read, I will say: Simon Doran and John M. Quay, both knew me very well in the service and might remember about my frosted feet in the service.

Q. In your original declaration for pension under the general laws, you state that you contracted rheumatism and soreness and swelling of feet caused by exposure, lying on damp ground, marching &c. - In an affidavit executed by you September 15th, 1888, you ^{say you} contracted your disabilities going from near Petersburg, Va. to Newbern, N.C. Then again, in an affidavit executed by you, Feb. 17th, 1896, ^{you say,} that your feet were frost bitten in the service and you contracted rheumatism in the service and that you believe the "whole thing" occurred while you were stationed at "Moody Hunters", Va. Before me you say that you did not have the rheumatism in the service and that your feet were frost bitten on the boat while you were on your way from Bermuda Hundred to Fort
