"My age is *48* years, I reside in Baltimore, Md., at No. *224* *Helene* *Alley* Street,

I was not present at the marriage of the soldier Emmonds the Claimant's husband and Emmonds - but saw them right after they were married and know that from that time until about 10 years before the war with the soldier's death they lived together and recognized each other as husband and wife and were regarded by all who knew them. I know that Catherine was the only child left by the soldier under 16 years of age at his death and that she is still living and is hopelessly insane and entirely dependent upon the Claimant. I know that the Claimant has not remarried since the death of her husband the soldier. That she owns no property and is entirely dependent upon her daily labor for support that she earns at support in washing & ironing. I know these facts from my personal knowledge and intimacy with the parties mentioned.

This testimony was all written in my presence and only from my own oral statements then made to me at the office of A. P. Lloyd on July 19, 1893 and that in making them I have not been aided or prompted by any written or printed statement or recital prepared or dictated by any other person except the Hon. Commissioner of Pensions. I have no interest in this claim

Instructions - Read Carefully.

Under the order of the Commissioner of Pensions number 229 in the preparation of testimony in support of claims in pension cases, all statements the particular and not merely must be written and prepared to be typewritten in the presence of the witness, and from his oral declarations then made to the person who then reduces the testimony to writing or then prepares the same to be typewritten. And such testimony must embody a statement by the witness that such testimony was all written or prepared for type-writing (as the case may be) in his presence, and only from his oral statements then made; stating also the time, place, and person, when, where and to whom he made such oral statements, and that in making the same he did not use, and was not aided or prompted by any written or printed statement or recital, prepared or dictated by any other person; and that attached as an exhibit to his testimony.
