I know Catherine is the oldest of the two and I know she was a little thing toddling around the house when Mary was born. We lived on Montgomery St. where Catherine was born. Yes sir James Enolds was the father of Catherine and all of my children. Now, I never had no man but Jim Enolds. Yes sir I am positive I lived with James Enolds long before the war. We were never separated at any time except when he was in the army. We lived together at the time he died in the house where I now live. I lived on Montgomery St. while Enolds was in the army. I rented a house and kept house there. When Enolds exhibited he was to get \$300 ^{fron} in the installment plan. Col. Brown was to pay the wife. I got two payments of \$20⁰⁰ each and then Col. Brown went away and I never got any more money. I never knew what was done with the rest of the bounty. I was to have \$30⁰⁰ per month but never got only two payments. After the bounty stopped I used to wash for the soldiers and do such work as I could get until Jim came home. I fully understand the contents of this statement.
