war. She grew up and died about 7 years
ago. Yes, sir, I was living with my
husband when he went to war. Of my
ten children by Enolds, all but Catherine
was born before he went to war, but only
three were then living. I had a child
each and every year after our marriage
until he went to war. At that time my
youngest child was three years old. Yes, she
was the last child born before my husband
went away. I went out to Camp Belger with
my husband when he enlisted. I knew Sgt.
Harris of my husband's Co. (now dead, I am.) I
also knew a Sgt. Hilliard of some company but
do not know where he is now. I did not know
many of his comrades in service. My husband's
true name was James Enolds. He got a
pension before he died. He died July - 1893.
He only got two pensions (payments) before he
died. Yes, I think he did get a big lot of money
the first time but I do not know the amount.
