Hon. O. P. S. Clark,

Commissioner of Pensions,

Sir:

I have the honor to return herewith the papers in the claim for pension No 227,082 of Emiline Jolley, widow of John Jolley, late Private Co. F. 7th Regt. U.S.C. 19. She alleges that the immediate cause of the soldiers death was consumption contracted while in service. There is no record of alleged disease. The records show that he was wounded Sept. 29: 1864 and sent to hospital; returned to duty Nov. 14/65.

Emiline Jolley
the Claimant - Ex. A. - states that she married claimant Oct. 20: 1868. Knew him prior to enlistment in Rochester Co. Md. He was sound up to enlistment. Had a cough at discharge and continuously thereafter up to his death. He died of consumption contracted in the service. Is unable to state for whom he worked subsequent to discharge. He did choose as he appears to be unable to do hard work. Claimant was not married prior to her marriage to deceased soldier and has not re-married since his death. No children. Thinks he died August 4: 1870 but is not certain of time as her memory is poor and she has no record of his death. Reputable for truth good.
