J. Brown, who, being by me duly sworn according to law, deposes and says, that he  
is a Physician and Surgeon, in regular practice, and resides at Baltimore, in the County  
of Baltimore, and State of Maryland, and was acquainted with

John Golly, who, he is informed, was a Private  
in Co. D. 7 Regiment W. S. Colored Troops Vols., and attended or prescribed

for him, as follows, for the following disease or disability: (1) Tubercular Consumption

1<sup>st</sup> Hygienic 2<sup>d</sup> Local and General the medicinal treatments was adapted to the site of the Local Deposits and the General nature of the Case I commenced the said treatments 15<sup>th</sup> Janu 1870 continued to the date of his death having died the 4<sup>th</sup> of August 1870 with the said disease

Deponent further says that the condition of the said John Golly was debilitated very much  
after his discharge from the service aforesaid, about May 10<sup>th</sup>, 1868, and while under his treat-

ment, (2) the said John Golly was examined with Stethoscope and through Pectorilloguy his lungs were found to be in a very critical Condition many Cavities therein rendering him

and that as to his condition at the time of his enlistment in said service, about the 26<sup>th</sup> of Sept-  
ember, 1863, and prior thereto, deponent says, (3) he was told by

the said John Golly that he was in good health strong and active and that it is his opinion that the said John Golly's disease was contracted while in the Service of the U. S. A. from Excitements of his Nervous System and general Exposure

Deponent further says, as to the habits of the said John Golly very good  
during his knowledge of him, that (4) he was very Religious and moderate in his habits and may styled a Christian

And further, that he has no interest, direct or indirect, in this claim.
