I am the claimant in this case. The Soldier Robert Barnes was discharged from the Army about latter part of January 1867 in Texas. As soon as he returned to Baltimore he came by boat to our home on Hoopers Island Dorchester Co. Md. This was in early spring of 1867. He remained with me about two months, that was in summer of 1867. He then commenced "backing off" going away for a week or two, coming back and staying overnight, this habit he kept up for several months when he left me altogether. It was during this time I became pregnant and bore him our son George who was born three or four months after he abandoned me.
