

# Declaration for Widow's Pension.

Act of June 27, 1890, as Amended by Act of May 9, 1900.

*Norm*

State of MARYLAND, CITY of BALTIMORE, ss:

ON this 15 day of Febry, A. D. one thousand nine hundred and four personally appeared before me, a \_\_\_\_\_ within and for the County and State aforesaid,

Frances Barnes, aged 65 years, a resident of Baltimore, County of \_\_\_\_\_, State of MD

who, being duly sworn according to law, makes the following declaration in order to obtain pension under the provisions of the ACT OF CONGRESS APPROVED JUNE 27, 1890, AS AMENDED BY THE ACT OF MAY 9, 1900:

That she is the widow of Robert Barnes who was

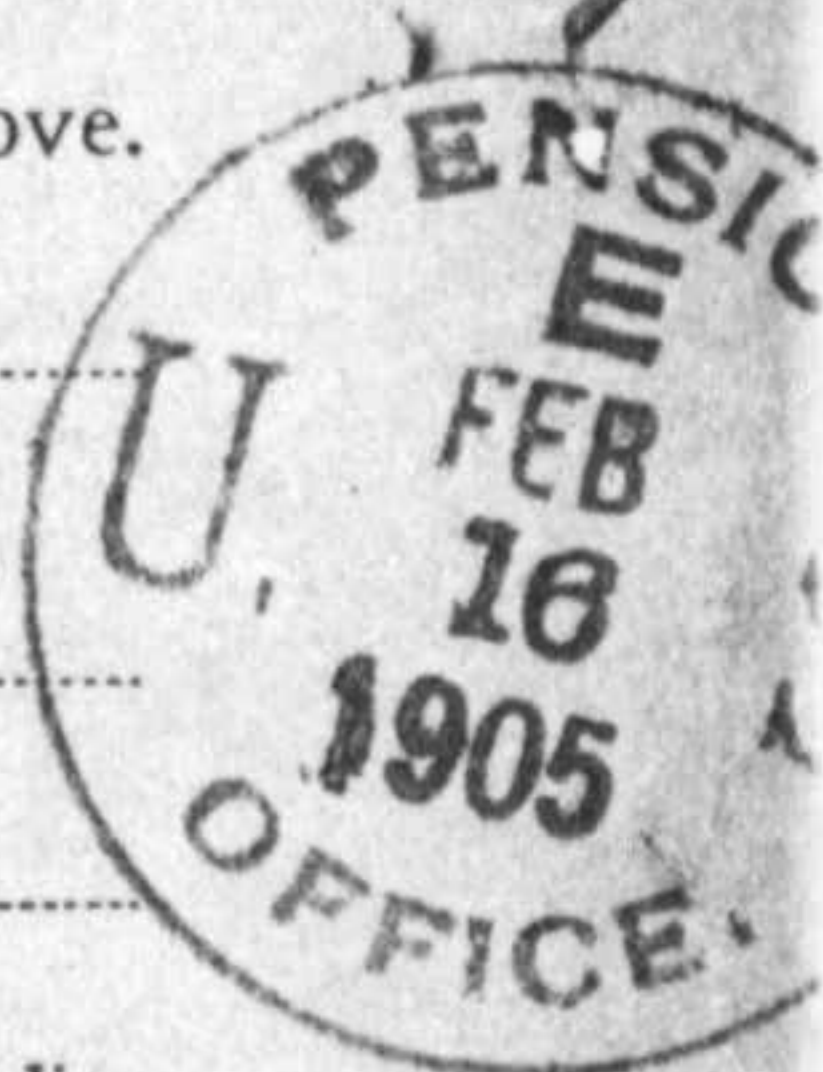
as a Private in Co K 19th U. S. I. Reg.

Here state rank and designation of organization or name of vessel

and honorably discharged 1866 having served ninety days or more during the late war of

the rebellion. That the soldier was not in the MILITARY OR NAVAL SERVICE of the United States except as stated above.

If any other service it should be stated in full



That she was married under the name of Frances Dorsey to said soldier

at Meekins Neck Dorchester Co Md on the \_\_\_\_\_ day of Summer, 1861

by Rev Mr Turner; that there was no legal barrier to the marriage;

that she had not been previously married; that the soldier had not been previously married.

If there was a prior

marriage of either, the date and place of death or divorce of former consort or consorts should be stated

That the said soldier died Janry 17 1865 at Baltimore Md that she was not divorced from him; that she has not remarried since his death; and that she is without other means of support than her daily labor and an actual net income not exceeding two hundred and fifty dollars per year.

That the NAMES AND DATES OF BIRTH of all the children of the soldier, now living, and under SIXTEEN YEARS OF AGE at the date of the soldier's death, are as follows: *(If the soldier left no children, the claimant should so state.)*

*That she was married to soldier by a religious celebration lived with him up to his enlistment and after his discharge in 1866 he returned to her and had a child by her, he then deserted her and went up with a woman named Harriet Pritchard, then a woman named Hizzie Rich & then with*

That she has heretofore applied for pension.

Annander Hopkins If prior application has been made the number thereof, the service on which it was based. after soldier deserted her went through a marriage ceremony with Isaac Handy who

That she hereby appoints A. PARLETT LLOYD,

reported dead If she desires to employ an attorney of BALTIMORE, MD her true and lawful attorney, to prosecute this claim,

and directs that the sum of Ten Dollars be paid to her for his services.
