

28 maker in this city for years and years and was well
29 known and owned his residence at the time of his death.

30 Q. How many times have you been married?

31 A. I was not married prior to my marriage to Heath.
32 I have given birth to two children - one by Charles Daily
33 and the other child was by Jacob Heath. The first child
34 was not named as it died soon after its birth. I lived
35 with Charles Daily for four or five years and took his
36 name but we were never married by ceremony or with a
37 license and we separated when we disagreed. Daily was
38 not a soldier or a sailor. He may still be living at 916
39 Pierce street. He was a single man at date of living
40 with me and I was young at the time, was 16 or 17 years
41 old when my relations with Charles Daily began and we
42 lived in Briscoe st and in Dover Street and at different
43 addresses and I was considered to be his wife and have
44 never owned up that we were not married until filing a
45 claim for pension. No sir I did not marry Charles Daily.

46 Q. How many times was the soldier Jacob Heath married?

47 A. Four times and his first wife was Frederica Eliza-
48 beth Brown, the second wife was Harriet Boadley, the
49 third wife was Sadonia Mason and I was his fourthwife.
50 I was acquainted with Harriet Bodley and Sadonia Mason. Mr
51 Heath was divorced from Harriet and Sadonia died in this
52 city in February before my marriage to Jacob Heath in June.
53 Frederica E. Brown was dead before the second marriage of
54 Jacob Heath he always claimed and others said the same
55 thing. But I cannot give the place or date of her death.

56 Q. Did not Jacob Heath have another wife?

57 A. No sir he did not. I am the fourth wife sir.

58 Q. I have been informed that he was married four times
59 prior to his marriage to you? A. It is a mistake. Jacob
60 Heath married all of his wives in Baltimore, he went to
61 the war before he was married the first time he said. He
62 was not married to any woman on Kent Island in Kent Co Md.
