DEPOSITION D

Case of Rosetta Mills, No. 431819.

On this fifth day of Nov., 1891, at Baltimore City, County of State of Md., before me, James F. Ely, a Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared Rosetta Kembley, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer truly all interrogatories propounded to her during this Special Examination of aforesaid pension claim, deposes and says: I am about 50 years of

age - occupation housekeeper - wife of Isiah Kembley - and residence and post office address #608 Pine St. Baltimore City, Md.

I have known Rosetta Mills since childhood in Queen Ann Co. I knew her husband Thos. Mills and I recollect when they were married in Queen Ann about five or six years before the war. Her husband went to the war when they lived over in Queen Ann. I forget how many children she had; but she has two now living - they are men grown and married. I have known her for the past year or two years in this city - and knew her husband William up to the time he died. I never knew or heard that they were divorced or had any separation, except that she was sick and could not work and he went to himself. I don't know exactly when he left her; but I know she used to be cook for a Mrs. Holman and was taken sick. Then Mills broke up his house and went to himself - and she had to go to her own.
