When we first came to Baltimore my husband used to carry a load: but after a while he had to give it up and took to whitewashing. I always had to help in the support of the house, and after I was taken down sick at Mrs. Stone's

my husband broke up housekeeping and went to live by himself. He had got his pension allowed while I was sick.

Mr. Lloyd was my husband's Attorney, but I don't know that Mr. Lloyd knew of I being his wife until I applied.
