 I am the widow of William Hills
 I was married to William Hills, at
 Queenstown, Queen Ann Co. Md, in
 the month of August - about five or six
 years before the war. I was only about
 fifteen years old when I was married.
 My husband was fifty four when he died.
 My husband resided at Queenstown,
 Md, in the Winter - just a few days before
 Christmas; but I don't recollect the year.
 in Co. C. 19. U. S. C. Troops. He was wounded
 while in the Army and was pensioned
 for the wound - it was in the right wrist.
 but he never told me what he got.
 He died here in Baltimore City - on
 a Friday morning, between 10 & 11 o'clock,
 the 27th of June 1890 - I forget the number
 of the house - on Fulton Terrace. At the
 time my husband died, I was not living
 with him. I had been laid up and
 unable to do anything for over a year
 and went to my son. My husband
 was on Fulton Terrace. I had been un-
