and for the State and City aforesaid, personally appeared Jannie K Brown and Mary C Sutton, the former residing at Centreville aforesaid and the latter at Baltimore but now residing at Centreville state of Maryland and to me well known, and whom I certify to be respectable and intelligent, and entitled to full credit and belief, and who being duly sworn according to law and thus deposeth:

My age is 46 years and I reside as above stated. at Centreville, Queen Anne County, Maryland. I know Rosetta Wells - Before the War she belonged to my Mother Alice E Bryan and myself. She lived in the family until sometime after the War commenced. I knew William Wells - While Rosetta Johnson was a servant in the family then living at Queenstown, Queen Anne County aforesaid. William Wells courted and married her - I was present and witnessed the marriage ceremony. They lived as man and wife thereafter for many years the remaining in the family and having several children - The marriage ceremony was performed by the Rev. W. Morris of the Methodist Episcopal Church in the presence of my Grandmother now deceased, my Mother Alice E Bryan and myself & others, some of whom are living in this County at this time and others in Baltimore City - Mrs Mary C Sutton their daughter in our family and worshipped the memory

Mary C Sutton deposing and says, I reside on Myrtle Avenue Baltimore City, 3<sup>rd</sup> door from Larroch, in family of J. William Sterling - in 1855 & 1856 lived in the family of the said mother and stepson of Mrs Jannie K Brown at Queenstown and relates their marriage of Rosetta Johnson with William Wells. Witnessed the marriage of Rosetta Johnson with William Wells. Rosetta a Rose or she was called a rose in the family as a house servant. She was daughter of Mr Sallie Ann Johnson, now Mrs. Anna Hadleton who resides in Queen Anne County at this time - Anna Hadleton who resides in Queen Anne County at this time -

The marriage ceremony was performed by the Rev. James B. Morris of Methodist Episcopal Church, about 1855, at Queenstown, Queen Anne County, Maryland - She was present at the marriage also Mrs Jannie K Brown then a child - also Mother and Grandmother of Mrs. Morris. I am now fifty four years

now. Rosetta Johnson lived for several years afterwards in the family of mother of Mrs. Brown of Cork and had several children - William Wells and Rosetta Wells formerly children of Rosetta Johnson after emancipation & after the War removed to Baltimore County.
