DEPOSITION B.Case of James Gibson, No. 536,135

On this fourth day of Aug, 1888, at  
Baltimore, County of Johns  
 State of Md., before me, Geo. Smith, a  
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared Perry  
Johnson, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer  
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid  
 pension claim, deposes and says: I am 47 yrs. of age: a laborer;  
 and live at 7 Mt Vincent Alley, Balto. Md.  
 I was born near Royal Oak, Md.  
 I was born free. I lived at St. Michaels  
 Md. when I enlisted. I enlisted at  
 Balto. Md. I cannot tell the year, I  
 enlisted in Co. "B" 7<sup>th</sup> U. S. C. T. I  
 served three years and was with  
 the Co. all of the time. I was dis-  
 charged at Balto. I don't know the  
 year. I cannot remember the  
 names of any of the officers of my Co.,  
 nor of the Sergeants, or Corporals. I don't  
 remember that there was another  
 Perry Johnson in the Co. I knew  
 James Gibson before I enlisted and  
 knew him in the Co. I know he  
 worked for Miss Kitty Dennis before  
 he enlisted. I have never seen  
 him since I left the army. I  
 don't know that he had anything  
 to do with him in the service  
 nor at any other time. I am never  
 in a battle. I don't know where we  
 served. I know we went away on  
 the cars and a long way on a vessel.  
 I don't know whether it was Texas  
 we went to or not. I don't know
