Since his return home from the army I have seen them a dozen times or more and they are much worse than they were when I first saw them. In consequence of his injury he has been very much disabled and has not been capable of doing more than one half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) the manual labor of an ordinary man. I have seen him every week or two since we were mustered out of the army and know that he has been disabled as I have here stated by reason of his injury. I don't know on which side he is injured, but think it is the right side. I am not related or interested in this claim.
