I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt from your office of application for Pension No. 149,631, and to return it herewith, with such information as is furnished by the files of this office.

It appears from the Rolls on file in this office, that Vincent Demby was enrolled on the 23 day of September, 1863, at Queen Anne Md., in Co. "C", 7<sup>th</sup> Regiment of U. S. C. Troops Volunteers, to serve three years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a Corp'l on the 26<sup>th</sup> day of September, 1863, at Baltimore Md., in Co. "C", 7<sup>th</sup> Regiment of U. S. C. Troops Volunteers, to serve three years, or during the war. On the muster-roll of Co. "C", of that Regiment for the months of Jan. organization (1863) to Oct. 31, 1863, he is reported "Detached on Recruiting service Oct 29 1863" - Rolls from October 31, 1863 to August 31, 1864 "Present for duty" September and October 1864 "Wounded and sent to Hospital Sept 29" - Rolls from October 31, 1864 to February 28, 1865, "Present for duty" - Rolls from February 28 to December 31, 1865, "Wounded and sent to Point of Rocks via April 2, 1865" January and February 1866 "Discharged on Surgeon's Certificate of disability at Fort Monroe on Jan 2, 1866" and is so accounted for on Muster-out roll of Co. (Corp'l) Certificate of disability for discharge sent to Pension Office January 27, 1866.
