DECLARATION FOR INVALID PENSION.

State of New Jersey, County of Camden, ss :

On the day hereinafter mentioned personally appeared before me Charles A. Kelly a Notary Public within

and for the County and State aforesaid, William C. Johnson, aged 45 years, a resident of 1048 Ferry Ave County of Camden State of N. J.

who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the identical William C. Johnson who was ENROLLED as a Private on the 22 day of May, 1862, in Company E, in the 7 Maryland Regiment of Maryland Infantry Volunteers, and served at least ninety days in the late War of the Rebellion, in the service of the United States, who was HONORABLY DISCHARGED at Rehanna, on the 7th day of October, 1865.

That he has not been employed in the military or naval service otherwise than as stated above Two Gun Shot Wounds on in foot and one in Breast

That he has not been in the military or naval service of the United States prior to 22 day of May, 1862

That he has not been in the military or naval service of the United States since the 7 day of October, 1865

That he is wholly unable to earn a support by manual labor by reason of Gun Shot Wounds

THAT HE WAS BORN ON THE 2 DAY OF March 1839 about

That said disabilities are not due to his vicious habits, and are to the best of his knowledge and belief permanent.

That he has been applied for pension under application No. has Received no Pension That he is a pensioner under Certificate No. has Received no Pension

That he makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension-roll of the United States under the provisions of the act of June 27, 1890, as amended by the act of May 9, 1900. He hereby appoints
