

Act of June 27, 1890.

DECLARATION FOR INVALID PENSION.

NOTE.—To be executed before a Court of Record or some officer thereof having custody of its seal, a Notary Public or Justice of the Peace, whose official signature shall be verified by his official seal, and in case he has none, his signature and official character shall be certified by a Clerk of a Court of Record, or a City or County Clerk, unless such certificate is already on file in the Pension Office, when such fact should be stated.

State of Maryland, County of Hartford, ss:

On this 8 day of July, A. D. one thousand nine hundred, personally appeared before me, Robert Stafford,

a ~~Justice of the Peace~~, within and for the County and State aforesaid was born in 1823 aged 67 years, a resident of the town of Cumtuck County of Hartford, State of Maryland who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the identical Person who was ENROLLED on the 22 day of September 1863, in 7 Maryland Infy Comp A (Here state rank, company, and regiment in Military Service, or name of vessel, if in the Navy.) in the service of the United States in the war of the rebellion, and served at least ninety days, and was HONORABLY DISCHARGED at Baltimore, on the 22 day of January 1864 That he has not been employed in the military or naval service otherwise than as stated above.

(Here state what the service was, whether prior or subsequent to that stated above, and the dates at which it began and ended.)

That he was not employed in the Military or Naval service of the United States BEFORE the 22 day of Sept 1863, or AFTER the 22 day of Jan 1864.

[NOTE—Insert date of first enlistment and final discharge.]

That he is unable to earn a support by manual labor by reason of his Eyes (Here name ALL the diseases, injuries, or wounds from which disabled and state WHEN, WHERE and UNDER WHAT CIRCUMSTANCES each wound or injury was incurred as nearly as possible.) are getting worse all the time, his is suffering from general debility has swelling of feet and legs, also has assumed various infirmities very much with it

That said disabilities are not due to vicious habits, and are, to the best of his knowledge and belief, permanent. That he has applied for pension under application No. 3032171 That he is a pensioner under Certificate No. 3032171 (If a pensioner, the Certificate number only need be given. If not, give the number of the former application, if one was made.)

That he makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension-roll of the United States, under the provisions of the Act of June 27, 1890, as amended by the Act of May 9, 1900.

That he hereby appoints, with full power of substitution and revocation,

W. W. DUDLEY & CO., OF WASHINGTON, D. C., his true and lawful attorneys to prosecute his claim, the fee to be TEN DOLLARS as prescribed by law. That his POST-OFFICE ADDRESS is Cumtuck (Give street and number if resident of city or town.), County of Hartford, State of Maryland
