

DECLARATION FOR INVALID PENSION.

Act of June 27, 1890.

This Must be Executed Before a Court of Record or Some Officer Thereof Having Custody of its Seal.

State of Maryland, County of Dorchester, ss:

aged 57 years, a resident of the town of Cambridge,

County of Dorchester, State of Md., who, being

duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the identical Robt Stafford,

who was ENROLLED on the 14th day of Sept. 1863 in

Co. A 7th Md. S. I. T. (Here state rank, company and regiment, in Military service, or vessel, if in the Navy.)

in the war of the rebellion, and served at least ninety days, and was HONORABLY DISCHARGED at Baltimore, City (Hospital), 22nd

day of January, 1866 That he is comparatively unable to earn a support by

reason of Affection of eyes, (Here name the disease or injuries from which disabled.)

That said disabilities are not due to his vicious habits, and are to the best of his knowledge and belief permanent. That

he has applied for pension under application No. 41,327. That he is a pensioner

under Certificate No 303,171

(If a pensioner, the Certificate only need be given. If not, give the number of the former

application if one was made.)

That he makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension roll of the United States under the provisions of the Act of June 27, 1890. He hereby appoints

A. B. Webb of Washington D.C. his true and lawful attorney to prosecute his claim, with full power of substitution and revocation.
