## Examining Surgeon's Certificate.

Baltimore May 2<sup>d</sup>, 1867.

I hereby certify, That I have carefully examined  
John Johnson, late a Private Co. A. 7<sup>th</sup>

Applicant's service.  
U.S.C. Troops

in the service of the United States, who was discharged at  
Baltimore, on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of January,  
1865, and is an applicant for an invalid pension, by reason of  
alleged disability resulting from gun shot wound.

Degree of disability.  
In my opinion the said John Johnson  
is totally incapacitated for obtaining his subsistence by  
manual labor from the cause above stated.

Origin.  
Judging from his present condition, and from the evidence before  
me, it is my belief that the said disability occurred  
in the service aforesaid in the line of duty.

Probable duration.  
The disability is permanent

Gun shot wound of left shoulder, ex-  
cision of head of humerus & four inches  
of its shaft - arm swings helplessly at  
side - disability equivalent to loss of hand.
