in the service of the United States, who was discharged at Dalton, on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of January, 1865, and is an applicant for an invalid pension, by reason of alleged disability resulting from gun shot wound

In my opinion the said John Johnson is totally incapacitated for obtaining his subsistence by manual labor from the cause above stated.

Origin.

Judging from his present condition, and from the evidence before me, it is my belief that the said disability occurred in the service aforesaid in the line of duty.
