Sir:

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt from your Office of application for Pension No. ...., and to return it herewith, with such information as is furnished by the files of this Office. On reply to your inquiry of Dec 1<sup>st</sup> 1861,

It appears from the Rolls on file in this Office, that John Johnson was enrolled on the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of September, 1863, at Baltimore Md. in Co. "A", Regiment of W. C. Jaap's Volunteers, to serve 3 years, and during the war, and mustered into service as a Private on the 26<sup>th</sup> day of September 1863, at Baltimore Md., in Co. "A", Regiment of W. C. Jaap's Volunteers, to serve 3 years, and during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. "A" of that Regiment, for the months of Sept. and October 1864, he is reported "Absent wounded since Oct. 13 1864". On Muster Roll of Co. for Nov<sup>th</sup> Dec<sup>th</sup> 1865 he is reported "Discharged at Ft. Monroe Va. on Surg Cert. of Disability Oct. 20 1865"

This man was discharged at Fort Monroe Va. Oct. 20. 1865 on Surgeon's Certificate of disability. By some means he was admitted into Sick U. S. Hospital Baltimore Md. after receiving his discharge and application made to this Office by that Gen. Surgeon U. S. who is in charge of that Hospital for a Descriptive List of the man. A partial Descriptive List was furnished upon which he was discharged a second time on Surgeon's Certificate of disability January 10. 1866. Certificate of disability received at this Office January 12. 1866 and sent to Pension Office January 13. 1866 with the following remark endorsed "This certificate is fraudulent as the man was discharged at the General U. S. Hospital Oct 20. 1865."
